Critiques by Breed Judge: **Courtney Spencer (Tullaview Border Collies)**

I'd like to begin with a heartfelt thanks to the club for the invitation to judge at your 5th Championship Show; I was honoured to officiate and thoroughly enjoyed my appointment as well as your hospitality. Thank you to the exhibitors for presenting me with such a consistently typey entry, with many quality exhibits presented on the day in top condition, and for accepting my decisions with grace. Thank you also for entertaining me with some additional laps of the ring, and giving me the time to not only consider my placements but also appreciate your dogs over the course of the day. I found the show to be very well run, relaxed and convivial which was truly the icing on the cake for me.

My ideal Border Collie is harmonious and free flowing from nose to tail showing gracefulness, effortless and that much-sought-after "perfect balance" - I looked for this in my winners both standing and on the move. I found this ideal silhouette in several of my class winners, and in particular my Best In Show and Runner Up Best In Show, who as it turned out are both young exhibits and I'm sure both will continue to impress into the future as they mature. Congratulations!

I was pleased to find in my examination of the exhibits on the day pleasing breed type, length of leg, and heads on the whole I considered to be of high quality. Bites and teeth, correct feet and coat quality were on the whole very good and thus they do not feature very often in my critiques. I was most impressed with the temperaments of the exhibits almost without exception, with many endearing youngsters who warrant commendation as well as biddable, steady and reliable mature Border Collies who worked for their owners and were keen to please. This, I feel, is so important to our breed and its ability to be fit for function (as well as fulfilling their primary function of being much loved members of any family), and the breeders who showed to me today are therefore to be applauded for continuing to produce Border Collies with correct, breed-typical temperaments.

Please consider my critiques below a snapshot of my impressions of the dogs as I saw them on the day.

Baby Puppy Dog

1st **3 – TOOKURRA STUNT DOUBLE** *Paula Wachtel*

Promising 5-month-old black and white male with a very pleasing mild, keen expression with dark eye and good set of ear that were alert. Balanced and very good angulation front and rear, lovely level topline which he held well on the stack and on the move. Lots of hind on this baby which he should grow into, neat well let down hocks and long tail, was collected on the side gait showing good reach and drive and correct footfall.

2nd **2 – BORDERSRIDGE EYES ON THE PRIZE** *Ms M Schiller*

4.5-month-old black & white male, strong attractive head with good underjaw, oval dark eye. Pleasing front angles but a little loose on the day, good overall body proportions and balance. Would like to see him with a touch more hind angle for balance but this may come with age. His coat coming through is of good texture. A happy, outgoing puppy who moved with a sense of purpose when he got going.

3rd **1 – GETAWAYBACK MATE YA DREAMIN AT UTTERCHARM** *Joanne Symonds*

5-month-old black tricolour smooth coat male, strong head with slightly larger semi-erect ears at this age. Good reach of neck and body length complemented by a long tail, soundly angulated in both quarters, he has lots of leg to grow into. A little loose and close in front today and needs to develop in chest. Very good coat texture and friendly temperament.

Junior Dog

1st **5 – CH WYNNLAKE STEAMY DREAMS** *Ms C Thompson*

Stylish 14-month-old black and white male who immediately gave the impression of a smooth and graceful outline, good reach of neck, lovely level and strong topline with graceful croup and well set-on long tail. Typical head with good ears, dark oval eye and a pleasing intelligent gaze. Well angulated youngster with excellent prosternum and lay back of shoulder, balanced in his hind angulation. He moved with purpose and a ground covering action, excellent topline and footfall on the side gait, true coming and going. Excellent coat texture and presentation. A very promising youngster who needs more time to mature.

BEST JUNIOR IN SHOW

2nd **4 – KERENSA SOUTHERN STAR** *Mrs K Wahlheim*

13-month-old black and white male who needs more time to grow into himself, up on leg but overall sound in his proportions. Strong head with correct eye colour and placement showing typical expression, ears not quite settled yet. On examination his topline was relatively level but did show a tendency to bounce a little on the move, would want a little more angulation and spring of chest which may come with age, he moved soundly and with some balance.

Intermediate Dog

1st **8 – TOOKURRA ALL IWANT F CHRISTMAS** *Mrs P M Wachtel*

Top quality 2-year-old black and white male of excellent breed type and immediately appealed for his smooth, graceful outline and correct balance and proportions throughout. This dog had a really lovely mild, keen and alert expression, dark oval eye and very well placed and used ears. Correct front and rear assembly which was cohesive and balanced, excellent reach of neck flowing smoothly into his shoulders when he stood freely. Moved with a tireless and easy action consistently, minimum lift of feet, excellent footfall and held the correct shape going around, clean coming and going. A beautiful typey exhibit who I suspect will be a truly impressive dog when he matures.

RUNNER UP BEST IN SHOW

2nd **7 – MERRINDA AS LONG AS YOU LOVE ME** *Lyn Allshorn*

Stylish 2-year-old black and white male who immediately drew the eye for his excellent overall breed type, proportions and balance presenting the desired outline. He had an attractive masculine head, dark eye which were a touch rounder than ideal but these did not detract from his overall kind and alert expression. This dog stood very soundly over the ground, with excellent reach of neck and top-notch front assembly including prosternum, and complemented by his well angulated rear and neat hocks. He showed the capacity to move with balance and a free stride, however on the day not quite driving with his hind.

3rd **9 – WYNNLAKE DANGER IN THE DARK** *Wendy Vidugiris*

Nearly 2-year-old male with pleasing breed type on the whole, exhibiting a mild expression with well-placed ears and a dark eye. His front assembly was sound and balanced by his hind, but would prefer to be more well angulated overall. He held his topline on the move and used what he had, but for me on the day he was close behind and I would prefer a smoother, more graceful sweep over the croup and set of tail to complement his front. Good coat texture and quality.

Limit Dog

1st **12 – WAVENEY WHAT THE FUNK** *Ms K J Martin*

Strong 3-year-old black and white male, up on leg and size, showing masculine and overall typical breed type. He has a pleasing head and intelligent, keen expression, dark eye and well-placed ears. Balanced in his angulation, although would want for more both ends to allow him to drop into himself on the move more, and slightly longer neck for elegance. Good topline and croup, moved with purpose and soundly coming and going, showing good footfall on the go around. Moderate, weather-resistant coat.

BEST LIMIT IN SHOW

2nd **10 – BORDACROFT BURNING BLUE** *Bordacraft Kennels*

3-year-old blue merle male of excellent silvery colour and pigmentation, with overall good breed type and soundly constructed. Typical head and expression with flat skull, although more chiselling and moulding to his muzzle would give him a more refined and milder expression. Very well-balanced front and rear, level topline and a nice sweep over the croup which showed on his easy gait, he was true coming and going. A very typical border collie but would want for some more strength overall for his age, however noted he was not in full coat today. Presented in fit and athletic, muscular condition.

State Bred Dog

1st **14 – TOOKURRA KING FOR A DAY** *Mrs P M Wachtel*

5-year-old black and white male of overall very pleasing breed type, correct length of neck and body, sound in construction. This dog had a strong but keen and intelligent expression and kind dark eye, but could benefit from a touch more moulding to soften his expression. He had excellent front angle and lay of shoulder into his withers, however a little narrower through the body than ideal which showed on his out and back. Smooth sweep over his croup and carried a typical shape on the move, could hold his topline a litter firmer but this did improve as class went on.

2nd **13 – CH BORDACROFT WEAPON X** *Bordacraft Kennels*

Beautifully rich-coloured 3.5-year-old red and white male, masculine but overall moderate and harmonious in general appearance. Typical and expressive head, strong muzzle and skull, could benefit from a touch more refined chiselling to add mildness to his expression, but had good eye and ear placement which he used to his advantage. Very pleasing overall body proportions and balance in his fore and hind quarters, although would like a better return of upper arm. Good body length and moved soundly, showing purpose and energy.

Australian Bred Dog

1st **17 – CALEE NEXT IN LINE** *Mr J Wallwork*

2-year-old black and white, pleasing style of male with a good reach of neck, balanced and correct proportions across his body finished with a smooth sweep over the croup. He had a typical head and expression showing keenness and a kind dark eye. Good front angulation and prosternum, however would like to see more spring of rib to hold him together. Very good hindquarter angulation which matched his front and thus had an easy and balanced stride on the move with minimum lift of feet, clean but closer than ideal fore and aft.

2nd **16 – CH DANARI DUKE OF DANGER** *Bordacroft Kennels*

3-year-old black and white masculine male with overall good proportions with a typical, pleasing head which was quite strong in the muzzle, oval eye and expressive with semi-erect ears when alert. He had a good reach of neck into a sound front, body and hind however would like to see more return of upper arm and a slightly lower-set hock in rear for balance. He could appear a little squared-off over the croup on the stack and tended to kick his rear a little higher than ideal, but moved soundly and with purpose in all directions.

3rd **15 – WILDERBLU NIGHT OF NIGHTS** *Amy Eatts*

Strong headed 3-year-old black and white male with good depth of muzzle and very masculine expression, pleasing overall body proportions and reach of neck to give him a typical shape. Satisfactorily angulated overall, he was a little narrow through his body and thus closer than ideal on the out and back, but showed the ability to move soundly although not striding out with enthusiasm on the day.

Open Dog

1st **21 – TOOKURRA SHAKEN NOT STIRRED** *Mrs P Wachtel & Mrs M Schiller*

3-year-old black and white male who immediately stood out for his breed type, showing a harmonious and smooth outline. His head was strong yet mild, very expressive, dark oval eye and well-placed ears and good moulding. He had an excellent front assembly with correct layback of shoulder, upper arm and prosternum, good length of body and well-developed hindquarter and short hocks, his clean graceful sweep over the croup finished the picture. He is a little shorter in leg than I prefer, but this did not hold him back on the move as he showed a clean, smooth gait with minimum lift of feet - he got better the more he was worked. A fairly heavily coated boy which did hide his outline at times in the wind.

BEST OPEN IN SHOW

RESERVE CHALLENGE DOG

2nd **20 – CH MERRINDA SIGN OF THE TIMES (AI)** *Mrs L F Allshorn*

2-year-old black and white male of overall balanced and cohesive shape on the stack. He had a very pleasing head, kind oval eye that showed alertness, a little less moulding to his muzzle but this did not detract from his mild expression. Excellent reach of neck flowing into his shoulders and good front angulation. Whilst his rear is adequate and sound, I would like to see him with a touch more hindquarter for balance and a gentler slope over the croup to finish the picture. He moved soundly coming and going with an easy, ground covering stride, although could kick up a little high when moved at speed. The youngster in the class, he did show his age today.

3rd – **19 – SUP CH NAHROF ICE BREAKER** *Mr M J Fisher*

8-year-old black and white male, the elder statesman of the group but in incredible condition and fitness, he appealed standing for his overall proportions, leg length and balance. He had a typical head with a mild expression and a kind eye, ears were a touch wider set but used well. Smooth outline, very good front angulation, level topline and clean over the croup. He could benefit from a little more strength in the hind and so moved a little closer than ideal on the out and back, covered the ground on the side gait with an easy stride but could tend to kick up a little higher than ideal. Excellent coat texture and presentation.

Challenge & Reserve Challenge Dog

I really enjoyed judging this challenge as there were several worthy dogs of different ages in contention, each with attributes to admire. My Challenge (Intermediate class winner) won on the move with his free, effortless and easy-on-the-eye gait that he sustained every lap, whilst he was a somewhat 'green' dog with his showmanship on the stack, he excelled on the go-around and proudly displayed his breed type from all angles. The Reserve Challenge (Open class winner) was awarded for his classic breed type on the stack that consistently appealed, a very harmonious male who moved soundly and with purpose at a collected pace with minimum lift of feet and worked hard for the place, but not quite the same 'pep' in his step as the youngster on the day.

Baby Puppy Bitch

1st **24 – BEECEE GOTTA LUV HER STYLE** *Mrs K Wahlheim*

Nearly 6-month-old black and white bitch who was really well put together and exhibited very good breed type. She had a very pleasing and typical head, quite a sweet expression and kind, dark eye. Very nice length of neck and balanced fore and hind angulation which she used to her best advantage on the move where she strode out with purpose and drive. She is a little shorter in leg than I prefer at this age. Level topline with overall smooth and graceful shape – loads of promise.

BEST BABY PUPPY IN SHOW

2nd **25 – TOOKURRA DOUBLE DENIM** *Mrs P M Wachtel*

5-month-old blue and white bitch who showed good breed type and proportions. Her head was very pretty and feminine, lovely eye shape and placement and well used ears giving the desired alert expression, excellent blue pigmentation and eye colour. A balanced youngster with good front and rear angles and overall pleasing proportions creating a smooth outline. I would prefer to see her with a little more neck to give her a touch more elegance. Moved well when she got going, and clearly a bright and bubbly personality!

3rd **22 – WILDERBLU READY OR NOT** *Mrs A Eatts*

5-month-old chocolate and white bitch of typical breed type and good overall proportions. Her head is developing into itself at this age and needing to fill particularly in her cheek and depth in skull. Soundly constructed fore and hind quarters showing moderate balance. Up on leg, moved soundly in all directions and well collected in her stride, a little higher over the loin on the go around today which could be owing to age.

Puppy Bitch

1st **26 – BELCLAREN A FLASH OF LIGHT** *Annette Orsborn*

10-month-old black and white bitch who was sound overall and had a nice length of leg under her body. A slightly sharp but fairly breed typical expression, relatively strong head for her age, well used ears. Good length of neck and a mostly level topline on the stack and moving. Whilst she has balance within her front and rear angulation, she could want for more in both quarters to allow her to really settle into herself on the move. At a collected pace she moved soundly, and had a friendly willing-to-please temperament.

BEST PUPPY IN SHOW

Junior Bitch

1st **28- WYNNLAKE DREAM HER OWN DESTINY** *Ms C Thompson*

Stylish 14-month-old black and white bitch who appealed for her smooth and harmonious outline, incredibly well presented with excellent coat (not so much in quantity, but certainly in quality). She had a very pleasing head and expression, a kind dark eye, would like to see her fill a little more in muzzle as she matures. Excellent front and hind angulation and correct length of leg, a firm and level topline and beautiful graceful sweep over the croup. She used all of her assets on the move, being clean and true coming and going as well as showing reach and drive on the side gait, her action being tireless and effortless.

2nd **27 – WILDERBLU PRIMA DONNA** *Mrs A Eatts*

15-month-old black and white bitch on the body profile who presented a harmonious overall outline. She has a potentially good head but would want for more development in stop and skull, and a higher set ear to give her that desired keenness of expression with maturity. Very soundly constructed fore and aft with relative balance. She moved well for her proportions and carried her head correctly, but could have moved with a bit more oomph on the day.

Intermediate Bitch

The largest class entry of the day with 7 exhibits and a diversity of styles represented.

1st **35 – CH WYNNLAKE LAVENDER HAZE (AI)** *Ms C Thompson*

2-year-old black and white bitch who stood out for her smooth outline, cohesive construction and giving the impression of balance from all angles. She had a very pleasing head and mild, keen expression enhanced by her dark oval eye. Beautiful reach of neck into an excellent front assembly, super level topline and very balanced in the rear, clean hocks. In fantastic hard, fit muscular condition and this showed on the move - she carried her shape very well on the go-around and moved with a free and purposeful stride which was consistent every lap with minimum lift of feet, very clean coming and going.

2nd **29 – QELTYNN CAUGHT IN THE ACT** *Amy L Eatts*

Nearly 3-year-old black and white bitch, a little plainer in style and markings but of pleasing shape and proportions. Typical head and expression with dark eye, could be flatter in skull with higher set ears to enhance her expression. Nice length of neck and very good lay of shoulder and front assembly, level topline (somewhat obscured by coat today), balanced rear angulation, neat hocks. She carried herself well on the side gait with an easy reach and drive, however a little down on pastern and flat in toes which show on the out and back.

3rd **34 – BEECEE DON'T STEAL MY STYLE** *Mrs Katie Wahlheim*

Nearly 2-year-old black and white, a leggier style of bitch who needs more time to come into herself, but overall typical breed type. She has a feminine head and expression, nice dark eye that was kind, could benefit from slightly higher set ears. Nice reach of neck, a good front assembly and adequate rear angulation which she used on the move. I prefer a little more slope over the croup. Won her place on the move today with her clean out and back and nicely collected side gait.

Limit Bitch

1st **36 – SASHDAN IN THE NYK OF TIME** *G Hall & D Inverno*

3-year-old black and white bitch showing a typical breed profile, up on leg but used them to her best advantage on the move. Satisfactory head and expression, could benefit from more fill and moulding to enhance her expression and a darker eye. Good reach of neck flowing into pleasing front angulation, level topline standing and on the move, a little narrow through the body for me. Moved soundly with reach and drive when she got going. Not in full coat today.

2nd **37 – BEECEE ALL THINGS NICE (AI)** *Mrs A Orsborn*

Pretty 2.5-year-old red and white bitch of good overall breed type, excellent colour and coat quality that was rich in tone. Typical head, kind eye, could appear strong in expression but this softened when she used her ears. Sound overall construction and fairly balanced front and hind, and moved well with moderate reach and drive. I feel she could benefit from increased fitness to help her stride out with purpose.

State Bred Bitch

1st **41- BEECEE CHERRY BLOSSOM (AI)** *Mrs Katie Wahlheim*

2.5-year-old attractive and balanced red and white bitch who was harmonious in proportions, pleasing amount of leg and very good breed type. She had a strong but feminine head, flat skull, gentle eye and used her ears to give expression. A good reach of neck that flowed smoothly into her shoulders with a level topline, she showed balance in her front and hind angulation, and a gentle slope over the croup. Moved soundly and consistently with drive, and was clean coming and going.

BEST STATE BRED IN SHOW

2nd **40 – BEECEE STOLE MY LOOK** *Mr D Martin*

Feminine and expressive 2-year-old black and white bitch who had very appealing breed type on the stack. She had an excellent head that was well proportioned, dark oval eye and excellent ear placement and she used these assets to her best advantage. A lovely reach of neck that flowed into her shoulders, clean front and pleasing overall body proportions. Excellent coat quality and presentation. She would benefit from a stronger developed and muscled hind to balance her front which unfortunately showed on the move, and carrying a little more weight than desirable today.

3rd **38 – WILDERBLU NOT READY TPLAY NICE** *Amy Eatts*

A soundly constructed 4-year-old black and white bitch of good breed type. A typical head that was balanced, however she could use her eye and ear for expression and to highlight her femininity. She has a pleasing length and flow of neck, level topline and balance in her fore and aft angulation which she used on the move, but could stride out with more purpose. Slightly flatter feet that ideal. Good coat quality and weather resistant texture.

Australian Bred Bitch

1st **42 – CH MERRINDA I MADE YOU LOOK (AI)** *Lyn Allshorn*

An instantly appealing 2-year-old black and white bitch that oozes breed type, she stands proud with a smooth, elegant outline and correct harmonious proportions of perfect balance. Her head is feminine but has strength, dark oval eye and well-placed ears which combine to create the desired mild, keen expression. Where she really excels is in her body, correct reach and set of neck flowing into an excellent forequarter, firm and super level topline, strong well-let-down hindquarter and graceful sweep over the croup to complete the picture. On the move she was clean and true on the out and back, and showed real ground covering, strong but effortless drive going around with minimum lift of feet. She was not in full coat today, but this only served to accentuate her quality. A classy bitch who, above all things, demonstrated that true Border Collie willingness to please and never faltered.

2nd **44 – UTTERCHARM FAIRGROUND ATTRACTN AT WAVENEY (AI)** *Ms J Johns*

3.5-year-old black and white bitch who was up on leg and sound in her overall construction, showing good breed type. Her head has typical proportions and expression, but could have more refinement and a slightly smaller ear to accentuate her femininity. She has a smooth flow of neck into her topline and over the croup, and a good front assembly. She would benefit from a little more strength in her hindquarter for balance and to allow her to move with greater drive, although in her movement she used what she had well.

Open Bitch

1st **46 – MERRINDA HOLLYWOOD ROSE** *Mrs L F Allshorn*

Harmonious 3-year-old black and white bitch who is very balanced and displays excellent breed type and body proportions. Her head is attractive and feminine but with strength, good moulding to her muzzle and kind, dark eye to present an excellent overall impression of alert intelligence. Fluid and smooth outline and a good spring of rib, excellent and balanced front and rear assembly and clean graceful sweep over the croup presents a classic shape standing and likewise on the move. Moved freely and with easy reach and drive, very sound in all directions, good footfall, minimum lift of feet and got better and better the more she worked.

RESERVE CHALLENGE BITCH

2nd **45 – CH CALEE WE LIKE TO PARTY** *J Wallwork*

4-year-old black and white bitch who was sound and of pleasing breed type. Feminine expression, kind eye that could be darker, well placed and used ears to present an alert gaze. Balanced in her proportions and angulation, although would want for more in both quarters to allow her to move with increased reach and drive. Carried her topline well on the move, a touch closer in rear movement than ideal, but used her assets well. Not in full bloom today.

Challenge & Reserve Challenge Bitch

My Challenge (Australian Bred class winner) was a magnificent bitch who commanded my attention at every opportunity – she was the whole package, standing and on the move, showing the grace, elegance and a tireless energy so valued in the breed. She was presented beautifully and sympathetically handled to allow her to shine. The Reserve Challenge (Open class winner) was an excellent complement to my Challenge winner in proportions, type and ground-covering movement – I later found them to be full sisters! Like in the males, there were others who were also deserving of recognition competing in this Challenge, some only held back by their maturity.

Open Neuter Dog

1st **48 – NEUT GRAND CH NOBLESTARZZ CRAZY IN LOVE** *Miss L Roe & Mr G J Dewing*

7-year-old black and white male, a distinguished gentleman showing a little 'frosting' on his face, but of good breed type and sound construction. He has a typical head and kind eye giving the right impression of masculinity, but head could have more moulding. Decent reach of neck, level topline and nice sweep over the croup, up on leg. Whilst he is balanced in his fore and aft angles, I would want for more in both quarters to allow him to really drop down and drive on the move, but he used what he had to his best advantage. Could fly his tail a little at times, had a friendly and easy-going nature.

Open Neuter Bitch

A class filled with four beautiful veteran matriarchs which epitomise the longevity and soundness so desired in the Border Collie. All were in outstanding condition and some could give their younger counterparts a run for their money. Each was a credit to their owners!

1st **52 – CH & NEUT CH WAVENEY KOZMOPOLITAN** *Ms J Johns*

Classic 12-year-old black and white bitch of excellent breed type and proportions who immediately appealed. She showed strength and femininity in her head, although a touch strongly developed in her skull owing to age, a dark eye and good ears creating a pleasing expression. Good reach of neck flowing into an excellent and sound forequarter, balanced with her well-angled hind which she could use on the move with reach and drive. Could show a slight rise over the loin on the move but this was not apparent on examination. Excellent coat quality and condition.

BEST NEUTER IN SHOW

2nd **49 – CH & NEUT CH NAHROF PLAY IT COOL** *Mr M J Fisher*

Feminine 12.5-year-old black and white bitch demonstrating the body condition of a dog far younger in years, of very good breed type and proportions. Strong but feminine expression, excellent keen and intelligent gaze enhanced by her dark well-placed eye. Good length of neck, very sound and balanced in front and rear assembly, and a good length of leg underneath her. A little squarer over the croup than I prefer (some of this impression owing to coat). Moved with purpose and very cleanly coming and going, showing a free, energetic stride on the side gait that she sustained with consistency.

RUNNER UP BEST NEUTER IN SHOW

3rd **53 – CH WAVENEY MIDNITE MARTINI** *Ms J Johns*

7-year-old black and white bitch of good overall style and breed type, particularly on the stack. Sound and balanced in her angulation and moved well at a collected pace, clean coming and going, demonstrated a slight rise over the loin at times on the move. Excellent coat and condition.
